## House Whites

1. **Jean Balmont Sauvignon, Vin de France, (France)**      £5.75   £8.50   £22.95  
Crisp & Juicy Sauvignon packed full of herbaceous, grassy fruit, with a tang of gooseberries. Lovely & fresh.
2. **Freedom Cross Chardonnay, Western Cape, Franschhoek Cellar (South Africa)**      £5.75   £8.50   £22.95  
A complete, lightly oaked Chardonnay coming from the beautiful Franschhoek Valley. Lychee and melon flavours are offset by hints of butterscotch, making this a full, satisfying white.
3. **Preciso Pinot Grigio, Terre Siciliane IGT (Italy)**      £5.95   £8.95   £23.95  
A fresh and easy Pinot Grigio with juicy fruit, lemony hints and attractive style. Produced in Sicily this has a fuller flavour than many wines from this variety

## House Rosé

4. **Angels Flight White Zinfandel, California (USA)**      £5.95   £8.95   £23.95  
A juicy refreshing rose packed full of crushed strawberry and raspberry fruit. The finish is well balanced with a hint of sweetness

## House Reds

5. **Jean Balmont Merlot, Vin de France, (France)**      £5.75   £8.50   £22.95  
Packed full of rich Southern French sunshine, this silky red is bursting with ripe plummy fruit, hints of dark chocolate and a lick of spice on the finish
6. **Paparuda Pinot Noir, Estate Selection, (Romania)**      £5.75   £8.50   £22.95  
Fragrant and fruity Pinot Noir with plenty of ripe red fruits, strawberries and raspberries, fresh and crunchy with hints of spice
7. **Wide River Shiraz, Robertson (South Africa)**      £5.95   £8.95   £23.95  
Easy going, soft red with plenty of spicy, peppery fruit, this has good hedgerow berry flavours and power. Shiraz is proving to be a very popular and successful grape variety in the Cape.

## Champagnes

8. **Ayala Brut Majeur** £47.00  
An excellent champagne and great value, this quality minded champagne house was bought by Bollinger in 2005. It has a wonderfully fine mousse, is well balanced, has finesse and complexity. A great aperitif, it works well with seafood
9. **Veuve Clicquot Brut Yellow Label** £67.00  
The full flavour of this champagne comes from good maturation. Soft, baked bread and biscuity nose, with creamy white fruits and a long lasting flavour.  
Stylish, elegant and full-bodied.
10. **Louis Roederer Brut Premier - Half** £37.00  
Embodying Louis Roederer's style - fresh, creamy, fruity and structured.  
Delicate yet rich with aromas of almonds, toast and may blossom. Creamy, round and silky, this is gorgeously luxurious, generous and mature in style.
11. **Veuve Clicquot Rosé** £69.95
12. **Dom Pérignon Champagne, vintage 2002** £215.00  
Dom Pérignon has a deservedly fine reputation. Rich, bready and yeasty with vanilla aromas and floral notes overlaying an intense, sumptuous palate of citrus, apple and pear.  
Very elegant with a superfine mousse and long finish.
13. **Krug Grande Cuvée, NV** £255.00  
Referred to by Krug as 'multi-vintage', the blend uses all three champagne grapes, 50 different wines from 6 to 9 different vintages, some as old as 15 years.  
A myriad of flavours, fresh, creamy, toasty, hugely complex and elegant.
14. **Louis Roederer Cristal Brut, vintage 2004** £320.00  
Intense aromas of white flowers, citrus and red berries then notes of toast and oak.  
White soft fruits, peaches and toast on the beautifully structured palate.  
The jewel of the Roederer House, created in 1876 for Tsar Alexander II.

## Sparkling Wines

15. **Prosecco Frizzante, Treviso, Fabio Ceschin (Italy)** £31.00  
The Prosecco grapes for this wine are from the foothills of Conegliano and Valdobbiadene. The result is a gently sparkling wine with lovely peachy fruit, the palate is deliciously juicy with super balance. A great apéritif.
16. **Castell d'Olèrdola Cava Brut Rosado (Spain)** £34.50  
A fresh and attractive wine with delicious summer fruit aromas and flavours of strawberries and raspberries. It is delicate and floral with a dry finish and is made by the quality minded house of Olivella Ferrari.
17. **Château Rives-Blanques, Blanquette de Limoux Brut (France)** £35.95  
Hand-harvested grapes and low yields, this is the world's oldest sparkling wine. Peach, pear and soft white fruits, floral too. Then dry, with touches of smoke and toast, more fruit and good finish. An excellent Champagne substitute.

## Rosé Wines

19. **Château Le Fagé, Bergerac Rosé 2018** £24.50  
An attractive, fruity rosé with juicy strawberry character and a good, fresh finish. Le Fagé is well situated on slopes overlooking Bergerac.
20. **Selladore En Provence Rose, Cotes de Provence (France)** £33.95  
Yet another achievement from this Herefordshire family. An attractive pale rose which is clean, fresh and juicy with plenty of raspberry fruit

## White Wines - Light & Crisp

23. **River Grandeur Sauvignon Blanc, Viljoensdrift, Robertson 2018 (South Africa)** £24.75  
Fresh Sauvignon with good depth of grassy character, juicy and lively.  
Zesty and refreshing.
25. **Château Le Fagé Sauvignon Blanc, Bergerac Sec (France)** £26.00  
Fresh, elegant Sauvignon, bursting with elderflower, crisp refreshing acidity and grassy, herbaceous fruit. Winemaking at Chateau Le Fagé dates back to 1920, and Benoit Gérardin continues its tradition of great wines
26. **Churton Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough (New Zealand)** £36.50  
A delicious full-flavoured Sauvignon, a wine full of ripe passion fruit and mango with a subtle mineral finish. This wine is extremely well-balanced with a lingering finish.
27. **Chablis, Caractère, Moreau-Naudet et Fils 2017 (France)** £40.75  
Rich, lemony fruit with plenty of concentration is the result of low yielding, 40 to 50 year old vines and careful winemaking by Stéphane Moreau, a keen young grower who espouses ageing in a mixture of vats and old wood barrels.
28. **Sancerre, André Dezat et Fils 2018 (France)** £41.00  
André Dezat and his sons produce one of the best Sancerres we have tasted; it is dry, fruity with a wonderfully delicate bouquet and great length. Their vineyards have three different types of soil which give added complexity.

## White Wines - Fruity & Aromatic

30. **Picpoul de Pinet, Domaine des Lauriers, Coteaux du Languedoc, (France)** £27.50  
Picpoul de Pinet is a very localised white grape growing just inland of the Mediterranean shore south of Montpellier. Marc Cabrol a typical fresh and mineral style that has all the lemony balance required to match fish and oysters
31. **House of Certain Views Unwooded Chardonnay, Hunter Valley (Australia)** £29.75  
This flavoursome white is made by Andrew and Lisa Margan from grapes sourced from contacts around the Hunter Valley. It is well balanced with fresh fruit.
32. **Bodega Piedra Negra Pinot Gris, Alta Coleccion, Valle de Uco Lurton (Argentina)** £31.00  
Rare in Argentina, the Lurtos harvest this variety first each year to retain the delicate bouquet and the rich complex flavours of peaches, apricots and raisins.  
Delicious and interesting.
33. **Bodegas Aquitania Bemon Albariño, Rias Baixas 2018 (Spain)** £33.00  
Creamy fruit, with plenty of yellow peach flavour and a good touch of underlying minerality.  
Complex and interesting wine from Galicia in north west Spain.

## White Wines - Full Flavoured

34. **Sunnycliff Chardonnay, Victoria (Australia)** £26.50  
Mildura in northern Victoria is the perfect place for vines, with water from the Murray and sunshine in abundance. This wine has sheer drinkability, everything is well balanced so one glass is not enough!
35. **Mâcon-Chardonnay, Talmard (France)** £32.75  
Growing grapes and wheat in a pretty area of mixed farming, the Talmard family makes a superb value Mâcon that has rich, citrusy fruit and creamy texture. It is both made from Chardonnay and comes from the village of Chardonnay.
36. **Journey's End Haystack Chardonnay, Coastal Region (South Africa)** £33.00  
A big, rich, South African Chardonnay packed with ripe tropical fruit flavours and a buttery character, it has good acidity which stops this being cloying. The Gabb family, who own this property, were originally from Shropshire.
37. **Saint-Véran, Christian Collovray et Jean-Luc Terrier (France)** £33.50  
Highly drinkable, full-flavoured wines are typical of brothers-in-law, Christian Collovray and Jean-Luc Terrier. Their Saint-Véran, an appellation that surrounds Pouilly-Fuissé, has smoky, rich, tropical, almost New World fruit.
38. **Pouilly-Fuissé, vieilles vignes, Collovray et Terrier 2015 (France)** £45.50  
Rich, racy Chardonnay fruit is combined here with spicy, vanilla oak to give a complex wine with great flavour and texture. Messrs Collovray and Terrier are brothers-in-law and business partners with modern cellars in Davayé.
39. **Meursault vieilles vignes, Buisson-Charles 2016 (France)** £71.95  
From five parcels of vines, a little from all over the village, this wine has balance and a fatter, less citric style than many Meursaults. It is fragrant, classically proportioned with a mineral edge.
40. **Puligny-Montrachet, Vieilles Vignes, Maison Roche de Bellene 2009 (France)** £80.50  
With a heady, floral perfume and subtle beeswax aromas this Puligny shows wonderful richness in the mouth. Fine minerality adds complexity to the palate and lingers on the finish.

## Red Wines - Light & Fruity

41. **Valpolicella DOC, Zeni (Italy)** £28.50  
The charming Zeni family, with their cellars and winemaking museum near Lake Garda, makes this delicious, soft, fruity Valpolicella. A short time in oak adds an extra dimension of flavour.
42. **Fleurie, Domaine de la Virolette, J Charlet (France)** £35.00  
Attractive, wild strawberry fruit is abundant in this wine making it a particularly juicy and good value example. Fleurie is the most famous of the ten superior, 'cru' villages of Beaujolais.
43. **Instinct Pinot Noir, Kate Radburn, Martinborough (New Zealand)** £34.95  
A succulent fruit filled Pinot with both red and black fruit flavours. It has good body and well balanced acidity. A characterful wine produced by Kate Radburn from Pask winery.
44. **Savigny-lès-Beaune, Louis Latour 2017 (France)** £39.50  
This excellent, violet-scented Burgundy comes from the famous old house of Louis Latour. It is soft and juicy with delicious raspberry fruit.

## Red Wines - Medium Bodied

45. **Cucao Carmenère Reserva, Valle Central 2015** £24.50  
A rich blackcurrant scented wine with some attractive herb notes. On the palate it is full of ripe black fruit underscored by delicious rich oak in good balance with the fruit, the tannins are ripe and the finish is long.
46. **Bodega Piedra Negra Malbec Alta Colección, Mendoza, Lurton (Argentina)** £29.95  
A medium-bodied, supple wine with soft tannins. Typically generous, concentrated black berry fruit, fat and spicy with a long lingering finish. Brilliant for roasts and barbecues!
47. **Chateau d'Argadens, Bordeaux Supérieur (France)** £31.95  
Purchased in 2002 by Sichels, this property is situated in the Entre-deux-Mers. The excellent terrior produces robust and soft fruited wines with concentration and balance. Argadens is one of the best Bordeaux Supérieur around.
48. **Alto del Obre Reserva, Rioja 2005** £37.00  
An intense and complex wine full of ripe blackberry and blueberry fruit with hints of cassis, the initial fruit is followed by a subtle flavour of spices, cinnamon, vanilla and cloves. The finish is long and aromatic.
49. **Château Montaignillon, Montagne-Saint-Émilion 2016 (France)** £42.50  
This has a delicious supple red fruit character of plums, blackcurrants and cherries backed up by good structure and ripe tannins. It will age well. The property is wonderfully situated looking down to Saint-Émilion and Pomerol.
50. **Gevrey Chambertin, Louis Boillot et Fils 2020 (France)** £76.50  
Coming from ten parcels of vines, this is a complex, harmonious Gevrey with good masculine structure but also a pretty edge. It has a spicy character, some aniseed adding to the mix of flavours. Long in the mouth and excellent!

## Reds - Rich & Full Bodied

51. **Sunnycliff Shiraz, Victoria 2018** £28.50  
Chunky red with sweet, brambly fruit & chocolaty flavours, this deliciously Australian wine is the very essence of sweet, ripe fruit
52. **Journeys End 'Pastors Blend' - Merlot/Cabernet Sauvignon (South Africa)** £31.75  
An attractive smoky fruit character on the nose, rich and plummy on the palate, this is juicy and very drinkable. From Stellenbosch
53. **Churchill's Estates, Douro Red (Portugal)** £32.95  
After years of research and development, Johnny Graham now has Churchill Estates producing excellent table wines. His Douro red has a complex nose, blackberry fruits and a floral hint, the eight months in oak giving rounded tannins.
54. **Bogle Vineyards Old Vine Zinfandel, Clarksburg, California 2016 (USA)** £37.00  
This is concentrated stuff, made from old vines. The dynamic Bogle team has produced a wine in which mouth-filling blueberry and blackberry fruit gives way to black pepper and chocolate mid-palate then on to a spicy finish.
55. **Doran Vineyards Pinotage, Voor Paardeberg (South Africa)** £37.50  
An elegant, concentrated Pinotage with good ripe fruit and plenty of raspberry flavours.
56. **Barolo DOCG, Manfredi 2014 (Italy)** £43.00  
Blender and bottler Manfredi makes a good value Barolo with aromas of dried fruit and leather then a rich mouthful with a good balance of acidity and tannin.
57. **Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Télégramme, H Brunier et Fils (France)** £57.00  
Lovely soft fruit with spice, plums, herbs and a touch of leather behind. Quite forward in the mouth with soft, ripe tannins, great length and a luscious finish.  
This is the second wine of Domaine du Vieux Télégraphe.

58. <b>Château Le Fage, Monbazillac 2015 (France) - Half</b> This is a luscious dessert wine, brimming with ripe botrytised fruit, both complex and intense. François Gerardin and son, Benoit, cultivate 40 hectares of rolling vineyard near Bergerac.	£8.50	£21.50
59. <b>Mitchel Noble Semillion, Clare Valley 2018 (Australia) - Half</b>  A great, full-on, late harvest sweetie with a silky texture and excellent balance.  Intensely concentrated tropical flavours on the mid-palate.	£9.95	£27.50
61. <b>Petit Guiraud, Sauternes 2016 (France) - Half</b>  This is a lovely well-balanced wine with citrus fruit and good acidity. Sweet but not cloying. The second wine of top Sauternes property, Chateau Guiraud.		£32.00

63. **Chablis, Les Valery (France)** £24.00  
This is textbook Chablis from one of the area's most successful producers. It has green-tinged hues, an elegant slightly steely quality with aromas and flavours of freshly baked brioche.
64. **Sancerre, André Dezat et Fils (France)** £24.25  
André Dezat and his sons produce one of the best Sancerres we have tasted; it is dry and fruity with a wonderfully delicate bouquet and great length. Their vineyards have three different types of soil which give added complexity.

## Red

65. **Chateau d'Argadens, Bordeaux Superieur, (France)** £20.50  
purchased in 2002 by Sichel's, this property is situated in the Entre-deux-Mers. The excellent terrior produces robust and soft fruited wines with concentration and balance. Chateau d'Argadens is one of the best Bordeaux Superieur around
66. **Rioja Vega Crianza, Rioja 2014 (White Label - Spain)** £22.00  
The winery at Rioja Vega was overhauled in 2001 and their wines have surged forward. From Tempranillo with a little Mazuelo and Garnacha, this smooth, soft, richly-fruited red, has spice and vanilla from 12 months in American oak
